

Delta Youth Admission Pass

Delta is offering the Youth Admission Pass for Delta youth between the ages of TEN (10) and EIGHTEEN (18) years of age. The Youth Admission Pass is replacing the Grade 5 through 8 Pass. This pass is intended to help promote a healthy lifestyle and physical activity for Delta youth.

Who is eligible for this pass?

Delta residents 10 – 18 Years of Age

- Pass starts when youth turns 10 years of age, or younger than 10 but enrolled in Grade 5 (must be able to prove enrollment – ie, report card, current student card)
- Pass ends once the patron turns 19 years old, or older than 18 but enrolled in Grade 12 (must be able to prove enrollment – ie, report card, current student card)

What proof of residence is required?

If a youth does not already have an existing account with Delta, proof of eligibility must be presented upon registration for the Youth Admission Pass, including:

Proof of birthdate

- Examples of acceptable government issued pieces of identification include:
- BC Services Card
- Birth Certificate
- BC Driver's License
- Passport
- Nexus
- Status Card

Proof of residency

- Examples of acceptable pieces of include:
- BC Services Card
- BC Driver's License
- Piece of mail
- Parent's BC Driver's License (if other forms are unavailable)

Is there a fee?

No, this pass is free!

Do international students get this pass?

Yes. If they can show the required proof of birthdate and residency (homestay address), then they may sign up for this pass.

What does this mean for Tsawwassen First Nation residents?

Residents of Tsawwassen First Nation are ineligible for this pass. The Delta Youth Admission Pass is only available to taxpaying residents within the City of Delta jurisdiction.

What if a patron goes to school in Delta but lives in another community?

They are not eligible for the Delta Youth Admission Pass. This initiative is for Delta Residents. If they are not able to provide proof of Delta residency and proof of birthdate, they are not eligible.
